Part of the week's experience was a Christmas shopping spree at a Myrtle Beach Target for 44 deserving kids from Horry County Schools. South Carolina's electric cooperatives provide each child, chosen by school district officials, a \$150 Target gift card to spend on clothes, toys and other items on their Christmas list.
