# Community Solar expands with new farm in Andrews

**THERE IS A NEW FARM** in Andrews and it's giving Santee Electric members more opportunity to participate in one of the cooperative's most innovative and environmentally friendly programs.

Santee Electric's new solar farm in Georgetown County has added 125 kilowatts of generating capacity to its Community Solar program. The new Community Solar farm started producing energy in June.

"We are excited to give our members an affordable, safe and reliable option for solar," says Rob Ardis, Santee Electric CEO. "Community Solar is a terrific way for members to come together and invest in renewable energy."

Santee Electric's Community Solar allows its members to share in the benefits of solar arrays installed at one location,

## Since June, when the Andrews community solar farm came online, enough energy has been generated to charge 8,571,400 iPhones and avoid 28 tons of $CO_2$ emissions and counting.

offering a convenient option for members who want to buy power from a carbon-free resource. Subscribing members receive credits for the solar energy generated without having to install panels on their roofs or worry about construction and maintenance. SEC, through its wholesale power provider, is responsible for the construction, operation and maintenance of the solar farm.

The price structure is flexible, allowing members to choose their level of interest, from one to five blocks per account. Pricing includes an upfront charge of \$50 per block and a monthly fee of \$14 per block, which represents 1 kilowatt.

On average, one block will produce approximately 150 kilowatt-hours per month. Each month, subscribers will receive 10 cents per kilowatt-hour produced as a credit on their bill. The production and credits will fluctuate from month to month based on time of year and weather conditions.

This is Santee Electric's second installment of a Community Solar farm. The Community Solar farm located in Kingstree began producing solar energy in May 2018 and has a capacity of 130 kilowatts. The cooperative has had members subscribing since 2018.

"I'm proud to help my co-op generate renewable, carbonfree energy," says Community Solar participant and Santee Electric trustee Donald E. Coker. "It's a low-cost, low-risk way to do solar."
